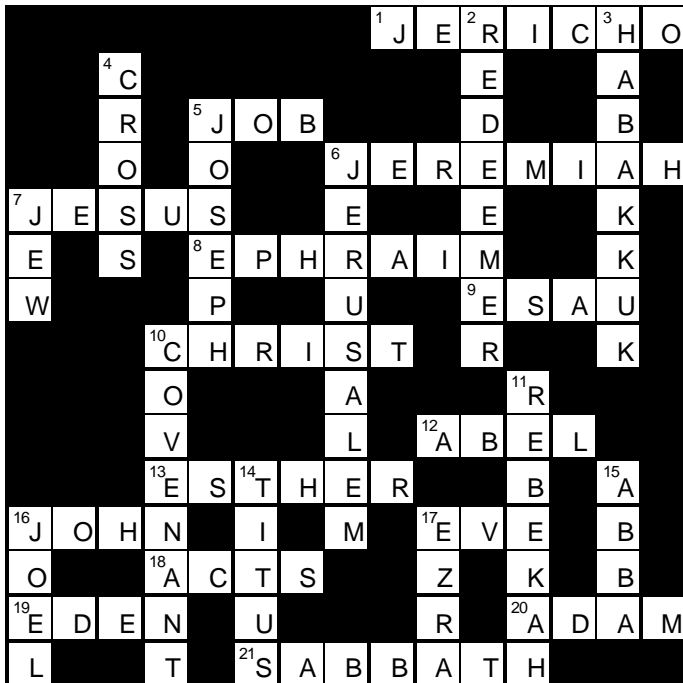


Basic Vocabulary Series I: Puzzle 9

JERICHO
5. An Arabian patriarch who resided in the land of Uz (q.v.). While living in the midst of great prosperity, he was suddenly overwhelmed by a series of sore trials that fell upon him.

JOB
6. One of the "greater prophets" of the Old Testament, son of Hilkiyah (q.v.), a priest of Anathoth (Jer. 1:1; 32:6).

JEREMIAH
7. The Lord's name.

JESUS
8. The second son of Joseph, born in Egypt (Gen. 41:52; 46:20).

EPHRAIM
9. Hairy, Rebekah's first-born twin son (Gen. 25:25).

ESAU
10. "Anointed."

| 17. Adam's wife. | EVE |
| 18. Last of the historical books of the New Testament. | ACTS |
| 19. The garden in which the first parents dwelt. | EDEN |
| 20. The man God created. | ADAM |
| 21. Saturday, the day on which the Jews were commanded to rest. | SABBATH |

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| 2. One who purchases back something that had been lost, by the payment of a ransom. | REDEEMER |
| 3. The eighth of the twelve minor prophets. | HABAKKUK |
| 4. The instrument of crucifixion. | CROSS |
| 5. A boy sold into slavery who saved his people from famine. | JOSEPH |
| 6. The city first mentioned in Scripture under the name Salem (Gen. 14:18; comp. Ps. 76:2). | JERUSALEM |
| 7. The name derived from the patriarch Judah. | JEW |
| 10. A contract or agreement between two parties. | COVENANT |
| 11. The daughter of Bethuel and the wife of Isaac (Gen. 22:23; 24:67). | REBEKAH |
| 14. A young evangelist to whom Paul wrote one epistle and who was with Paul and Barnabas at Antioch. | TITUS |
| 15. This Syriac or Chaldee word is found three times in the New Testament (Mark 14:36; Rom. 8:15; Gal. 4:6), and in each case is followed by its Greek equivalent, which is translated "father." | ABBA |
| 16. The second of the twelve minor prophets. He was the son of Pethuel. | JOEL |
